These legislators are vitally interested in this matter both on the subject matter of the legislation, and the general principles of constitutional structure. These state lawmakers also seek to protect the rights of their constituents and the voices of the people of their state. Unless the federalist structure created in our Constitution is

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upheld in this case, these legislators and their constituents will suffer significant injury to their liberties.

The Center and the legislators believe the issue before this court is one of particular importance to the notion of dual sovereignty and the preservation of States' police power. The plan of the Constitution is one of enumerated powers, limiting the reach of the federal government to those few areas of interest expressly granted by Constitution. Those interests which the Constitution does not direct Congress to regulate are left to the people and the states – a point made clear by the Tenth Amendment. While the federal government has the power to regulate commerce between the states, it does not have the authority to displace State governments' police powers to regulate for the general welfare within state boundaries.

The people of the state of Montana have exercised their right under the plan of the Constitution and the Tenth Amendment to control the purely intrastate activity of production, sale and regulation of small firearms and ammunition. This is not a regulation of interstate commerce. Instead this is a regulation of a purely instate commercial activity. Congress does not have greater power under the Commerce Clause to regulate a purely instate commercial activity because the commercial activity involves the manufacture and distribution of small firearms.

Amici believes that its participation will assist the Court by bringing to the Court information about how the use of federal commercial regulation on purely instate activities infringes upon the rights of the people and the states, in violation of the notion of dual sovereignty.

WHEREFORE, Amici Center for Constitutional Jurisprudence and state legislators of 17 states respectfully urge this Court to grant this application for leave to participate as amici curiae in support of plaintiffs.
